He was always interested in local activities and in government; he served as mayor of Otsego and on the Allegan County Board of Supervisors, now known as the Allegan County Commission. He was elected the Allegan County delegate to the state constitutional convention of 1961. After the Convention James was elected to six terms in the Michigan legislature. He was appointed by then Gov. William Milliken to serve as Assistant Director of the Department of Budget and Management before his retirement in 1979. James was a charter and life member of the Allegan Elks Lodge and the Rotary Club of Plainwell. James spent his winters in Florida and enjoyed playing golf year round, he had great love of music of all kinds, he also liked to fish and spend time with his family. His daughter Diane Crown of Lady Lake Fla., a son Stanley and his wife Marilyn of Richland survive James, also surviving are sisters Cynthia Coler of Three Rivers, Lettie VanWyk of Paw Paw and a brother Wilford Farnsworth of Arizona, grandchildren James, Joseph, John, Jeffrey and Jerome Farnsworth, Michael and Brian Crown, as well as 13 great grandchildren, several nieces and nephews including Nancy Johnson of Florida. James was preceded in death by his wife Margary, a sister Margaret Harter, and brothers Robert and Charles.
