He died on Saturday, Feb. 5, 2000, at his home. He was born on Jan. 5, 1937, in Paw Paw, Mich. He graduated from high school in 1955, and attended college in Michigan. He moved to Lubbock in 1971, from Panama City, Fla. He married Alice Gonzales-Day on Jan. 23, 1987, at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Slaton. He was a flight instructor at Reese Air Force Base. He served one tour of duty during the Vietnam War. He retired from the U.S. Air Force after 20 years of service and obtained the rank of captain. He then began working for the Texas Railroad Commission in 1980 until his retirement on Nov. 30, 1999. He was a Methodist and a member of the South Plains Kennel Club. He was active in hunting and fishing and outdoor hunting sports.

Survivors include his wife; his mother, Grace Crocker of Portage, Mich.; a son, Scott of San Antonio; a daughter, Dawn Ringler of Elizabethtown, Ky.; a sister, Lois Perrino of Kalamazoo, Mich.; a stepdaughter, Debra Day Robinson of Alpharetta, Ga.; and six grandchildren.
